Ayman Makki – Bibliography

Ayman Makki, born on March 9, 1982, is a practicing architect and instructor at the Lebanese International University (LIU). He is a Managing Partner at Makki & Associates, a family owned and run architecture and interior design office established in 1987 by both of his parents. He was exposed to the fields of art and design early on in his childhood and was always taught to observe and listen before attempting to speak and instruct. This way of bringing up is clearly evident in Makki's passion and admiration towards the art of teaching and in his capability of conveying information easily to any listener.

Makki underwent his architectural studies at the American University of Beirut and graduated in 2006 with a Bachelor degree in Architecture. During his final thesis year at AUB, Makki tackled a very sensitive topic; "Mental Illness in the MENA Region". He showed how architecture and design not only can be used to produce beautiful structures, buildings and designs but can be a very powerful tool used to heal the mentally ill. His focus on the topic was in particular "autism". Brought up in a house with an autistic brother, Makki drew his inspiration from his brother and his mental disability and used it to generate a successful final year architectural project. His efforts concluded in presenting and publishing his thesis at the "Youth in the Middle East and North Africa, Expanding Economic Prospects in Urban Areas". Exploited further, architecture can be used to resolve many of our now a days world problems and issues.

Right after his graduation, Makki travelled to Saudi Arabia and started working at one of the most prominent contracting firms at the time, and a few years later he immigrated to Montreal-Canada where he pursued his career and education until he became certified by the CACB and a registered architect at the Ordre des architectes du Quebec (OAQ).

During his time abroad, in addition to exploring different cultures, Makki gained valuable and interesting architectural construction methods and techniques from two completely unique and opposite climatic environments. On the first hand, Makki worked on projects in the harsh deserts of Saudi Arabia (+40°C) and on the other hand he worked on projects in the harsh freezing environments of northern Quebec (-40°C).

Years after his absence, Makki returned to Lebanon in 2015 to spearhead the office and continue his life and career as a passionate architect, teacher, personal trainer and loving father and husband.

Makki is currently focused on changing how the world thinks about architecture and design in general and on continuing his preaches about its importance as a powerful tool that can lead to positive change.

CONCEPT SHEET

House A is situated on a 2500 sqm plot of land with a panoramic view overlooking Beirut & Jounieh bays.

The GF public spaces are designed as free and individual units yet at the same time interconnected by a criss cross corridor and water features.

The entrance leads straight towards the exterior terrace and pool while flanking on both sides are the different programs that of: kitchen, stair lobby + zen garden, dining +

salon, guest toilet, bar lounge and another salon with a double height ceiling and a fully open and transparent facade acquired by the unique design of its windows.

This southern salon looks down at the basement's terrace, which is designed for the purpose of providing the indoor basement pool with natural light & ventilation and a separate entrance from and to the outdoor terrace and pool. The basement level can be accessed by the main stairs, the service stairs in the kitchen, and the outdoor stairs. In its turn, the upper level, is divided into five main spaces: a kitchenette, a living room, two suite bedrooms, and two master bedrooms. The main panoramic view is reserved for both of the master bedrooms which are facing west.

The master bedroom located at the south end is the one with the glass window looking down at the salon's void with a grandiose double height book shelf stretching all the way up from the salon at the GF.

The master bedroom located at the north end is cantilevered above the salon's terrace providing it with a nice shaded area and giving its user a pleasant projected view.







CONCEPT & APPROACH







PROJECT APPROACH

The Y.A.C project is located in the south of Lebanon isolated in a vast natural setting. The project came to be as a client's vision of enriching and providing the area with an activity program suitable for the surrounding residents.


The program is broken down into five major ones each of are: the main entrance hall, a youth block, workshop, restaurant / recreation hall and a stage.


The architectural design concept was to create a blend of both modern and traditional architectures in order to help this alien volume and program blend in with both of the surrounding culture and urban fabric. The idea was also to have separate functions yet spacialy interconnected architecturally and programmatically by an exterior circulation corridor which not only serves as the main circulation spine of the project but also is utilized as an outdoor exhibition space.

The main hall's design is the traditional Lebanese architecture with a cross vault interior space serving also as an indoor controlled and secure exhibition space.

The workshop and youth blocks are spaces provided to accommodate the major activities those of, woodwork, pottery, music, dancing, acting lessons etc...

As for the restaurant / recreation hall, it is the space which will serve as the money making part of the project which is designed with a separate entrance and a shared open courtyard in order to be easily rented out by anyone aiming at having a big dinner reception or marriage or any other reception of that sort.




CONCEPT SHEET & LAYOUTS

Our client inherited this house from his late grandfather. The house was destroyed during the war and all what was left of it was a small part. The surviving part stood a beautiful rectangular volume made up of cross vaults and six massive 1x1m stone columns. Unaffected by the instability and conflict of the area still had a vision and mission in mind to rebuild his grandfather's home and revive its legacy of being a major rendezvous place for influential political personnel and the symbol of strength and stability of the family.

The Architect's design concept was to salvage what was left of the house, turn into the main majlis and reception area and continue building the rest of the house around it. A huge kitchen was annexed to the majlis and all the bedrooms were located on the upper levels.


Making use of the pitched roof design, a huge recreational area was created for the kids were the spend most of their time with friends and family.
















